

Instructions for Authors: Place

This guideline is meant to help contributors who are writing an exhibit on a place. This category will focus on physical spaces that were innovative or are particularly important because of the many innovations that occurred in the space. These exhibits will describe why that place is considered innovative and the impact it has. If there were multiple innovations it will list the innovations that occurred there and why that space has lent itself to so many innovations. The detailed descriptions of the innovations will be in the innovation category. People who were also important to that space will have their own biography exhibit in the person category. All connecting exhibits will be linked.

Below you will find some suggestions and guidelines of what you should include in your exhibit. You do not have to follow the format exactly when writing your exhibit. Also you should include other information that you feel is important. Be creative in how you present the information. This should be thought of as a museum exhibit label rather than an article in a journal or Wikipedia entry. Make it interesting and fun for visitors to read while sharing this important knowledge! The starred items are information you should include and the other suggestions are optional:

- Title: Name of Place*
- What is the name of place?*
- Where is it located?*
- Why is it innovative/what innovations occurred here?*
- Who was a part of creating the innovation?
- What led to the creation of this building?
- Was there something unique about the building that played a significant role in these innovations?
- If there are any objects or pictures in a space the public can view on campus, list the object and where it is located.
- Any interesting facts or anecdotes
- Any images/videos you come across during your research
